Abstracts in te reo Māori

He whakarapopotanga ki te reo Māori

Abstracts are provided in both te reo Māori and English for articles written in Māori

- 1000 Māori abstracts since September 2007
- We expect to add a further 800 in the next year.
- Indicative abstracts reflect the tone and level of the article
- Looking to the future: Pacific language/interest journals

Access to online articles

- Approx 30% of new articles are available online
- Limit searches to online articles
- "Link to" or "Get article?"
- New PDF delivery option to be available next term

Lesson plans

- Articles that the author identifies as being designed to support teaching
- “Lesson plan” is the genre
- Search for “lesson plan” as a subject
Or
Your topic and “lesson plan” as keywords
- For articles that are about lesson plans search for “Lesson planning” as a subject

'Find' at the National Library

- Search all the Library's collections
 - new discovery tool encompassing multiple catalogues, digital collections, and other websites. It is currently in 'beta' as we collect user feedback.
 - Search for articles or search everything (including images & websites)

 - Hot topics
 - Suggest new titles

Titles as subjects

- Subject headings for title
 - so that articles about a title can be grouped & linked together
- title (author's surname, first name)
‘Awesome Aotearoa (Mahy, Margaret)’
- ability to see similar terms
and then drill down to more specific options
